

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

JOZEF ANTON — Joe has directed over 30 plays and musicals prior to this, his Kentwood directorial debut. Earlier credits include BAREFOOT IN THE PARK, ANGEL STREET, KISMET and NIGHT MUST FALL for the stage, and DAMN YANKEES for German national television. At the Maurice Kowalewski TV Videotape Workshop in Los Angeles, he serves as a teacher-coach to actors, and within just three years' membership at our theater, has himself portrayed key roles in TWIGS, ALL THE WAY HOME and FOLLIES.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER . . .

MERRILL EDELSTEIN — This versatile and spirited redhead is confident her firsttime producing effort won't be her last! During the past eight years, Merrill has lent a fine artistic hand to productions far too numerous to list here. As lighting designer and technician, stage manager or member of the backstage crew, her personal high standards are evident in every theatrical endeavor. Worthy accomplishments elsewhere include lighting design for THE SHADOW BOX at the Hyperion Theater in Los Angeles, and as a Member of House Staff for the Theater Arts Department of El Camino College.

ABOUT THE CAST ...

ELIZABETH ASH (Mme. St. Pe), during her 13-year tenure at Kentwood, this capable actress has distinguished herself with memorable performances in WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION, RASHOMON, HOW THE OTHER HALF LOVES and ALL THE WAY HOME. Following theatrical studies at UC Berkeley, Elizabeth appeared in many San Francisco and off-Broadway productions. Her most recent role was in THE SHADOW BOX for "Small Concern" at the Hyperion in Los Angeles.

IRV ROSEN (General St. Pe). If it can be said that someone has "done it all" for a community theater, then Irv is perfectly cast for the role. In over 20 years' membership, his acting credits are practically endless. Sensitive, intelligent performances in THE PRICE, A CASE OF LIBEL, A THOUSAND CLOWNS, NORMAN IS THAT YOU?, THE ODD COUPLE, TENTH MAN and PLAZA SUITE are just a partial list; he was also recognized as Best Actor at the L.A. County Drama Festival for his work in A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE. A past K.P. President and member of countless special committees, Irv received our coveted Best Director trophy for the powerful 1979 production VERONICA'S ROOM.

PAT Di STEFANO (Gaston, the Secretary), comes to us directly from intensive training at the American Conservatory Theater in San Francisco. His substantial background includes such varied works as THE HOUSE OF BLUE LEAVES, HEDDA GABLER, THE SAND BOX, OEDIPUS REX and THE ROSE TATTOO, Pat's performing interests also include singing and dancing for the musical stage: share now his no-longer-secret aspiration to perform as "Che" in EVITA on Broadway!

PATRICIA PARKS (Sidonia). Duluth, Minnesota's loss is our gain. While new to Kentwood, Patricia is no stranger to the stage, with prior credits in VANITIES, THE STRONGER, 12 ANGRY JURORS, HOW SHALL WE SING and AMID SOME-ER KNIGHT'S DREAM (that's right!). Now majoring in Theater Arts at UCLA, she plans to pursue a professional theatrical career.

MELISSA HARRED (Estelle). This self-styled "backstage star" makes her first appearance on stage in this show. During her three years' K.P. membership, Melissa has ably served as stage manager, lighting technician and crew member for several productions, and as producer for NORMAN IS THAT YOU? and SUMMERTREE.

PAUL FEUER (Dr. Bonfant), is a native of Brooklyn, N.Y. and student of Michael Chekhov and Etienne Delrous, Paul's first public performance was for the KUSC Teenage Radio Workshop. His diverse stage credits include roles in THE TAMING OF THE SHREW, GOD'S FAVORITE, AN ENEMY OF THE PEOPLE, ST. JOAN. ARIA DA CAPO, THE EGG and SHE STOOPS TO CONQUER.

ROSEANNE TORCASSO (First Maid), is a graduate in Theater Arts at UC Santa Barbara, Roseanne brings impressive credentials with prior key roles in THE BROWNING VERSION, FATHER'S DAY, CHAMBER MUSIC, and University Repertory performances of Brecht one-acts and two Sanskrit plays (THE VISION OF VASSAVADATA and THE CORTESAN MONK).

VICKI EBELING (Mlle, de Ste-Euverte), first appeared on stage at the age of nine in the title role of the children's operetta SNOW WHITE, and continued her theatrical pursuits until entering Michigan State University. She has recently renewed her interest in the performing arts with classes in acting, dance and guitar. Tonight's role marks her most welcome return to the stage.

MARY PAVONE (Mme. Dupont-Fredaine). Another welcome addition to our company of players, Mary attends UCLA where she recently performed in a series of one-acts by Coward, Brecht and DeGhelderode. Prior performing credits include THE CRUCIBLE, A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM, VANITIES, THE HOUSE OF BLUE LEAVES and GODSPELL. She admits to a passion for poetry writing, and is further building her craft through the study of voice and dance.

PHIL HALL (Father Ambrose). Phil's early theatrical experience came during two years on the road with a children's theater group, covering 26 states during one nine-month period and appearing as (among others) Long John Silver in TREASURE ISLAND! His more recent credits include ZOO STORY, I NEVER SANG FOR MY FATHER and HARVEY; for Kentwood, he has appeared in FOUR ON A GARDEN and STEAMBATH, the latter winning him a Masque Award last season.

LORI ANN LAMBERT (New Maid), delighted audiences as a member of the FOLLIES chorus, and we are equally delighted that she is again appearing in WALTZ OF THE TOREADORS. Her theatrical strengths also include scenic design (THE SILVER WHISTLE and GOD'S FAVORITE) and stage managing (VERONICA'S ROOM and THE SILVER WHISTLE). Lori's poise and stage presence are due in large part to her eight years of formal dance training.

JENNY ASH (alternate for New Maid), made her stage debut in her father's play THE MARK OF A LARGE YELLOW LEAD PENCIL, and her Kentwood debut about seven years ago in INHERIT THE WIND. Since then she's worked at Santa Monica H.S. in THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK, 12 ANGRY JURORS and THE GOOD WOMAN OF SETZWAN. Her most recent stage appearance was in our production of FOUR ON A GARDEN. followed by valued service as costume assistant for FOLLIES.
