SYNOPSIS OF SCENES

The action takes place in the living room of "Gillette Castle," home of William Gillette, in southern Connecticut.

Scene 1: The following evening, about 6:15

Scene 2: That night, about 10 o'clock

LEWIS HAUSER (Director): - Lew has directed numerous plays in the L. A. Area. At Kentwood: MUSICAL COMEDY MURDERS OF 1940 (Winner Best Director), LEGENDS, DAMES AT SEA, LEND ME A TENOR (Best Director, Best Play), CAN-CAN, and ACCOMPLICE. As an actor, Lew won Best Actor for PLAY IT AGAIN SAM. He was also in LITTLE FOXES, WHOSE LIFE IS IT ANYWAY, and most recently as the Captain in MR. ROBERTS.

VICTORIA MILLER (Producer): After 13 years of performing and choreographing for the Kentwood Players, Vicki produced MISTER ROBERTS and now POSTMORTEM. She has also produced shows at the Beverly Hilton. Other performance credits include FOLIES BERGÉRE, in Las Vegas, Disneyland's GOLDEN HORSESHOE REVUE, the Hollywood Bowl, Merv Griffin Show and South Bay Civic as well as other Southland theatres. This is the 12th show she has done with Lew Hauser.

TIM BOECK (Producer): Tim is proud to be working with another wonderful cast and crew on this exciting production. He thinks this time he bit off a bit more than he could chew, but rest assured the meal is wonderful. He was most recently seen on Kentwood's stage as the Barber in MAN OF LA MANCHA. Hopefully next time he will be content to have just one job in a show (with any luck that will be another role on stage).

DAVID ROW (Set Designer) - This is David's second show at Kentwood, ACCOMPLICE being his first. His other recent credits include BROKEN EGGS at he Morgan-Wixon Theatre and MEAT at the Powerhouse Theatre. David received his BA from the UCLA School of Theatre Film, and Television.

CAST (in order of appearance)

LIONEL TRAYNOR (Macready) - A native of Scotland, he made his way to the colonies on a merchant ship, having turned left at Greenland in 1967 during the Summer of Love. Finding Southern California a welcome respite from Auld Reekie, where the average temperature variance is 40 (20 above freezing to 20 below freezing), Mr. Traynor has made himself indispensable as the token Scot in many productions, including the Porter in MACBETH, Professor Oliver Lindbrook in JOURNEY TO THE CENTRE OF THE EARTH, and Angus the Gravedigger in THE COMMITMENTS. POSTMORTEM marks Mr. Traynor's debut at Kentwood; all who have worked with him have found him to be quite unique.

CHRISTOPHER LEMAN (Bobby Carlyle) [Nov. 16, 23, 24, 29, 30, Dec. 1, 6, 8, 20, 21]- Chris is originally from Chicago and has been acting for the past two years. His credits include several films and T.V. commercials and he appeared here at Kentwood previously as Lt. Kendrick in A FEW GOOD MEN. Chris is currently waiting to become famous.

CHRIS HAYWARD (Bobby Carlyle) [Nov. 15, 17, 22 Dec. 7, 12, 13, 14, 15, & 19]- Chris is back again by popular demand here at Kentwood. Having previously performed in A FEW GOOD MEN and IT'S ONLY A

PLAY. He has also been busy with various commercials and an independent movie, BLUES HIGHWAY.

PAULA SHIELDS (May Dison) - This is Paula's debut with the Kentwood Players, but certainly not her debut in theatre. She has performed at various Los Angeles Theatres in roles such as Kate in NEVER TOO LATE, Monica in THE JOYOUS SEASON and Kim in NEBRASKA. She has also recently completed 3 independent films.
