MARK DENNIS has a wide and varied background of show business and theatre experience. Regular Kentwood patrons will remember his roles in SUMMER AND SMOKE, TEN LITTLE INDIANS, and SEE HOW THEY RUN. Mark has appeared as a featured actor in more than 10 motion pictures for Columbia and Universal Pictures. At TV station KABC, Mark was a film director; and, currently, is an apprentice film editor for a Hollywood studio. Mark directed the 1964 summer play, TENDER TRAP.

ABOUT THE CAST . . .

GEORGE HEDGES (Bob McKellaway) is new to the Kentwood stage but belong to the Charles Laughton Shakespeare Workshop. He taught drama for five years and has directed musicals in high schools. George has also appeared on TV.

JUDITH BURDETTE (Tiffany Richards) played the role of Laura in the Kentwood production of THE GLASS MENAGERIE last fall. Judith received a four-year theatre arts scholarship to Marymount College, 1961-65, following her high school forensic award and the best actress award at St. Mary's Academy.

JIM McGREW (Oscar Nelson), another new comer to Kentwood Players, has had 20 years' experience with legitimate theatre, including summer stock in New England, and the Pittsburgh Playhouse. He has had major roles in THE MAN WHO CAME TO DINNER, FRONT PAGE, BROTHER RAT, to name only a few.
