

ABOUT THE PRODUCER

ABOUT THE CAST

JANE N. PORTER (Annie) makes her debut here at Kentwood with this play, but she's not new to this area. She was last seen in The Fox at the Studio Theatre in Long Beach. Jane is a graduate of the University of California at Irvine with a Masters Degree in Acting and has appeared in No Exit, Measure for Measure and Summerfolk at the University. Jane plans to persue her career as an actress until she can make it as a professional stripper!

KATHLEEN BOSWORTH (Sarah) is another newcomer to our Kentwood stage. She received most of her theatrical training at UCLA and the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art. A few of the many roles she has portrayed include such classics as The Actress in La Ronde, Cressida and then again Achilles in Trolius & Cressida, Lady Anne in King Richard III, the second witch in The Scottish Play and Gluttony in Doctor Faustus. Kathleen is presently taking further training from Ms. Barbara Woodhouse!

KIRK MUSTARD (Tom) is a new member who hails from Sterling, Kansas, where he majored in theatre at Sterling College. Roles played there include Shylock in Merchant of Venice, Peter in School for Scandal and Harry in Luv. He is bothered by a recurring dream where he dies and goes to Heaven, only to discover that all the good parts are already taken!

HOWARD LIEBGOT (Reg) is also a new member. he came to California in 1981 to attend the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in Pasadena. Since then he has appeared in No Sex Please, We're British at the LaHabra Depot Theatre; A Flea in Her Ear for the Norwalk Community Players and most recently in A Murder is Announced for the LaCanada Community Players. Howard worked his way through acting school in hopes of becoming a doctor!

While attending Princeton University, he completed a program in theatrical and dance training and also appeared in such classics as Romeo and Juliet and Antigone.
